

Managing Anti-Bribery & Corruption Risks

Sportsbet takes the risks posed by bribery and corruption seriously

Sportsbet is committed to acting professionally, fairly and with integrity in all of its business dealings. This includes ensuring that any risks arising from potential or actual bribery or corruption (defined below) affecting Sportsbet are identified, and properly managed so that they do not negatively affect Sportsbet's services, activities or decisions.

Further, Sportsbet acknowledges that awareness of, and compliance with the applicable Anti-Bribery & Corruption laws demonstrates prudent risk governance for Sportsbet and its business partners.

Therefore, we're asking Sportsbet's third party service providers for their assistance.

What is "bribery" or "corruption"?

Sportsbet considers "bribery" and "corruption" can take a number of forms and may include (but is not limited to) the following definitions:

- a) a "bribe" or "bribery" is the offering (directly or indirectly), promising, giving, accepting or soliciting of an commercial, contractual, regulatory or personal advantage as an inducement for action which is illegal or a breach of trust; and
- b) "corruption" is the abuse of entrusted power for private gain¹.

How to raise a concern

You are encouraged to raise concerns about any issue or suspicion of non-compliance with anti-bribery and corruption principles at the earliest possible stage. If you are unsure whether a particular act constitutes bribery or corruption, or if you have any other queries or concerns, please promptly inform us.

Sportsbet will then consider the potential implications of any concerns you may have and discuss with you any appropriate steps to manage the matter.
